

Thirty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ Year A

Handel's Messiah ~ in our own parish on Sunday Evening 17 December 2017



Messiah by Handel is a greatly acclaimed English language oratorio composed in 1741 by George Frideric Handel, with a scriptural text compiled by Charles Jennens from the King James Bible. It was first performed in Dublin on 13 April 1742 and received its London premiere nearly a year later.

After an initially modest public reception, the oratorio gained in popularity, eventually becoming one of the best-known and most frequently performed choral works in Western music.

Handel's reputation in England, where he had lived since 1712, had been established through his compositions of Italian opera. He turned to English oratorio in the 1730s in response to changes in public taste; Messiah was his sixth work in this genre. Although its structure resembles that of opera, it is not in dramatic form; there are no impersonations of characters and no direct speech.

Instead, Jennens's text is an extended reflection on Jesus as the Messiah called Christ. The text begins in Part I with prophecies by Isaiah and others, and moves to the annunciation to the shepherds. In Part II, Handel concentrates on the Passion and ends with the "Hallelujah" chorus. In Part III he covers the resurrection of the dead and Christ's glorification in heaven.

Handel wrote Messiah for modest vocal and instrumental forces, with optional settings for many of the individual numbers. In the years after his death, the work was adapted for performance on a much larger scale, with giant orchestras and choirs.

In other efforts to update it, its orchestration was revised and amplified by (among others) Mozart. In the late 20th and early 21st centuries the trend has been towards reproducing a greater fidelity to Handel's original intentions, although "big Messiah" productions continue to be mounted

The evening will begin at 7:00 PM, just one hour after the normal Sunday 5:00 PM Mass. It will begin with a few formalities and include some beautiful short musical selections from our own wonderfully talented parishioners. At 7:45 PM, there will be a brief intermission to allow the sanctuary to be fitted with chairs for the musicians and choristers. The performance of Handel's Messiah will begin at 8:00 PM

Tickets will cost just \$15 to offset minor expenses, and the cost to a family is just \$40. There will be many visitors from outside our own parish and, indeed, from outside the Macarthur. So demand for tickets is expected to be quite strong. Please contact Elizabeth from this Tuesday to book your tickets. Early payment is necessary. More news next week.



FHC Masses Next Weekend: Parents are asked to be mindful of the following:

Photography: Families should definitely ensure that cameras are available for photography before and after Mass. However, photography is not permitted during Mass because it becomes extremely distracting. Parents are asked to advise relatives and friends accordingly.

Reverence: Our Masses are sacred ceremonies. Silence and prayerfulness are important. So often at First Holy Communions, distant family members may come together after a long absence. Naturally enough, people like to converse. But parents are asked to advise their family and friends that casual conversation is much better suited to outside of the church.

Punctuality: Masses always start on time. Families should arrive in church at least 10 minutes early to allow their children to settle and compose.
