And the Bishop delivered a heartfelt homily. At the conclusion of Mass, well over 100 people – many from the visiting parishes – came over to the Heritage Hall for light refreshments and a few brief formalities. Sacrament of Penance Programme

Personalised books are available for collection after all Masses this weekend. Ordination of Bishop-Elect, Most Reverend Brian Mascord

A bus will be departing John Street outside the Church on Thursday 22nd February at 4:30 PM to travel to the Wollongong Entertainment Centre. Boarding the bus will be from 4:15 PM.

It is expected to arrive about 5:30 PM but there's always a little added time for parking. Those attending will be invited to move to the parish's allocated seating from 6:00 PM. Mass begins at 7:00 PM and is expected to conclude soon after 9:00 PM. People will need to be back on board the bus by 9:45 PM for departure.

The bus has a capacity of 60 and, so far, 40 seats have been booked. The cost is \$15 per person. Please be mindful that the organisers may have allocated a fixed number of seats, possibly 50. This could vary according to demand from other parishes. Should be a great night with beautiful sacred music and bishops in attendance from across Australia. Organisers are expecting about 75 priests and 4,000 people.

Another Lent Event is to be held on the Vigil to Laetare Sunday which is the Fourth Sunday of Lent. To have a complete experience of the Lent Event, our parishioners are invited to be present at the Vigil Mass and the walk rather casually to the Heritage Hall at about 6:00 PM with pre-dinner drinks for a 6:30 PM sit-down meal. Tables have about 9 or 10 parishioners. A per-person price of just \$15 includes a two-course meal with beverages. To make the evening even more interesting, members of the parish pastoral council again agreed there should be a few discussion topics.
