Catholic Cemetery on Cawdor Road Camden

Many of our parishioners would be aware of the Catholic Cemetery on Cawdor Road. It's owned by the parish although any financial advantage would have long since expired. Apparently, all the plots have been sold.

Recently a relative of one of the deceased who was buried in the cemetery complained to Camden Council that (to paraphrase) the parish should be more attentive to the manicuring around the graves. Council then visited the cemetery to make an assessment.

Over the years, the upkeep of the cemetery has been undertaken by many devoted volunteers. For many decades various people, and especially parishioners, have gathered to undertaking mowing and whipper snipping. That's been greatly appreciated. And more recently, a group of people undertaking community service have also assisted in the upkeep of the cemetery.

There's now an added problem that the cemetery is susceptible to dumping. In a conversation between Father Michael and one of the personnel from Council, there seemed to be consensus that a heavy-duty gate should be installed at the entry to the cemetery to prevent unauthorised vehicle access.

However, to hedge against the possibility of vandalism, Father Michael went further and raised the possibility of fencing around the whole site for reasons of both safety and security. If there was an accident, like a large headstone falling on a visitor, the parish could be exposed to potential liability. In terms of fencing the whole site, the employee from Council advised that further discussion within Council could be necessary.

Parishioners are welcome to share thoughts with Father Michael. There may well be quite a variety of feelings and opinions. The process of consultation will be most helpful in coming to a final decision. Please feel free to talk to Father Michael or email the parish office. This is a bit of a tricky situation so measured and thoughtful opinions will be graciously received.
