We served 130 meals approximately and were able to offer around 60 take-aways for later. We introduced take-aways containers after noticing many of our guests were attempting to store extra food in a very makeshift way. The end of lunch saw many happy faces and full tummies. Our volunteer group left for home tired but very pleased with another successful day.
