Our parishioners are advised that because of FHC, the normal 5:00 PM Mass will be celebrated at 4:00 PM next Sunday as a "one-off". The earlier finishing time allows the families and guests of the first communicants to have a little reception afterwards without finishing too late. Our usual parishioners are asked to be supportive with their presence, especially since there are only 19 First Communicants at this Mass. Mass will be barely 10 minutes longer than usual. FHC MASSES NEXT WEEKEND:

Parents are asked to be mindful of the following:

Photography: Families should definitely ensure that cameras are available for photography before and after Mass. However, photography is not permitted during Mass because it becomes extremely distracting. Parents are asked to advise relatives and friends accordingly.

Reverence: Our Masses are sacred ceremonies. Silence and prayerfulness are important. So often at First Holy Communions, some family members may come together after a long absence from church. Naturally enough, people like to converse. But parents are asked to advise their family and friends that casual conversation is much better suited to outside of the church.

Punctuality: Masses always start on time. Families should arrive in church at least 10 minutes early to allow their children the times to settle and compose.

Sacrament of Penance Programme

The first part of the programme begins on the First Sunday of Advent (from the Vigil 1st December and continues until the Third Sunday of Advent. Understandably, with many families away over January, the programme is suspended until after the summer holidays. The second part of the programme recommences early February.
