
Sister Mary Gregory SGS

A Vigil Service will be offered for Sister Mary on Sunday 13 January at 7.00pm and a Funeral Mass will be celebrated on Monday 14 January at 11.00am, both to be held at St Scholastica Chapel, 2 Arcadia Road, Glebe. The Vigil takes the form of Evening prayer when all her relatives attend as well as the Good Sams and friends. Her coffin is in the chapel. Supper is provided in the Function room after the liturgy and attendees tell stories of how they knew Mary.

Sister Mary came from an era when convent life was demanding and difficult, and without too many of life's creature comforts. During her time at Mater Dei she often attended the 9:30 AM Sunday Mass at St Clare's at Smeaton Grange.
