

Second Sunday of Ordinary Time - Year C 20th January 2019

Mary

The question is sometimes asked as to why the Catholic and Orthodox churches have such special devotion to Mary. The answer can be understood in the following way – Mary cooperated perfectly with the will of God and, as the mother of God's divine Son, was a person of purity, holiness and grace. Her life was unblemished in every respect. At Cana, when the wine was exhausted, it was upon Mary's intercession that Jesus worked his first miracle. It is for this reason that Mary is held by the Church as our primary intercessor. Similarly, it is very much within Catholic spirituality to ask Mary to receive our prayers and present then to her Son on our behalf. We can and should also pray directly to God, just as we do at Mass.









This coming Saturday is Australia Day and Mass will be celebrated at 9.00 AM with sacred music. Please be mindful that John Street outside the church could be blocked off because of community activities.

During Mass, some of the prayers that are specific to this celebration are particularly beautiful. The Opening Prayer – known as the Collect – reads as follows: *Grant we pray O Lord our God, that as the Cross shines in our southern skies so may Christ bring light to our nation, to its peoples old & new, & by saving grace, transform our lives.*

And the preface reads in part: "......for from ancient times you made this land a home for many peoples and became their rock of strength; when they were hungry you gave them food and when thirsty, water, even in the desert."
