

Third Sunday of Lent - Year C

Sacrament of Penance Programme ~ 2019

The programme for 2018/19 comes to completion this weekend. The many families who have participated - adults and children - have hopefully had quite a positive experience with Holy Mass, the workshops and leaders, booklets and clergy. There may have been times when adults have felt challenged and even confronted. But personal renewal, conversion and different ways of thinking are never easy.

One of the objectives of the programme is to assist all participants in the process of the examination of conscience. This should not be understood as a totally negative experience. There are many good and healthy qualities in the lives of all family members.

However, an examination of conscience does involve identifying sinfulness by (1) what we may have done wrongfully and (2) by what we may have neglected to do.

The term 'neglect' is of particular importance. It occurs about 20 times in the Old Testament and about 10 times in the New Testament. In the scene of the Last Judgement (Mt 25:31), the King remarks "What you neglected to do to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you neglected to do to me".

At the beginning of Mass, there's a general confession in which all present prayer together "I confess to Almighty God and to you my brothers and sisters that I have greatly sinned in my thoughts and in my words by what I've done and what I've failed to do...." At the penance ceremonies over the past week, the introductory prayer began "My brothers and sisters, we have neglected the gifts of our baptism and fallen into sin." (Rite of Penance, page 120).

So as families move forward, there's a real need for parents and carers to be continually attentive to the spiritual formation of the beautiful young children entrusted to their care.

Enrolments for FHC begin in early September. And sincere thanks are extended to the overwhelming number of parents, carers and extended family members who have been so responsive to the requirements of the programme.
