

Confirmation Programme 2019

Parents who have children in Year 6 or higher at school, and who have been baptised and celebrated First Confession, are invited to begin the process of enrolment by collecting a programme timeline after Mass. A part of the programme is for parents and children to have a weekly presence at Mass, especially since the Parish Community News (weekly bulletin) contains regular updates. If parents commit seriously to the requirements of the programme, they will be making a valuable investment into their children's spiritual formation.

Easter Triduum. The word *triduum* simply translates as ‘three days’. Lent came to conclusion from the beginning of the Mass of the Lord’s Supper on Holy Thursday evening when, at which time, the Easter Triduum began. Without qualification, everything in our parish went unbelievably well during the Easter Triduum with very large attendances at all the ceremonies.

Collectively, the Vigil, the three Masses on Easter Sunday morning and the Sunday evening Mass, have become huge with around 3,000 people in attendance. The screens in the chapel were quite valuable for the Sunday morning Masses in allowing about 50-100 people at each to see and hear everything that was happening. Easter Season ~ 50 Days

The Easter Season is of a fifty-day duration – from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday, with both Sundays included. The season is so distinguished in various ways, but especially by white vestments and the lighting of the Easter Candle. Beyond the Easter Season the large Easter candle – a sign of the Light of Christ – is lit only for baptisms and funerals.
