Position Vacant ~ Cleaner and Gardiner

Our parish church receives considerable attention every week of the year, both inside and out. Because the church is always preserved with such care and dedication, it's easy to presume that such attention to detail happens as a matter of course.

The reality is that the church is cleaned professionally inside every week, and is cleaned professionally outside every week with the inclusion of the toilets. The gardens also receive professional care. In addition, a group of dedicated parishioners contribute voluntarily to the enhancement and upkeep of the church, internally and externally. A portion of the financial offerings from our parishioners are used to meet wage costs and other ancillary expenses.



The external work for the past three years has been looked after by Mario. His official job has been formulated in terms of two three-hour shifts per week. The first is on a Monday to clean-up after the weekend, and the second is on a Friday (or Saturday morning) to prepare for the weekend. It's especially necessary that the gardens are in good appearance for weddings. However, there has been plenty of scope for variations.
