Sacrament of Penance Programme 2019/20

The programme began in early December 2019 with the enrolment period coming to completion on the fourth Sunday of Advent. Once all the parents and carers had enrolled their children, the required number of workshops were calculated and an appropriate number of books were ordered. Somewhat unfortunately, more than a dozen parents waited until last weekend until seeking to enrol.

Accordingly, some workshops will be overcrowded and more books have needed to be ordered. Parents and carers are asked to be more responsive to the program requirements for the FHC program later in the year.

If parents and carers feel inconvenienced by the program's requirements and regard sporting and social commitments as higher priorities, then its best to wait for another year until there's a stronger commitment. It's not possible for any programme to be administered properly if a large number of parents feel they can participate under their own terms.

The programmes in our parish are administered for the benefit of all our families, but also need to serve the interests of the 'common good'. As the great apostle St Paul said to the Thessalonians: "You must all think of what is best for each other and the community". 'Common good' is also a term used in Church law. It applies in the operation of our Catholic schools, and in the administering of large sacramental programmes. St Paul also says: "What God wants for all of us is to be holy".
