Pastoral Insight

- Have you ever thought about the value of the parish to you and to your family?
- Have you ever reflected upon the many memorable occasions of the parish church in your life?

These are important questions that are deserving of serious thought. The parish church – along with parochial churches like St Joseph the Worker – are the sacred places in which we come into each other's company as like-minded people. It is within the parish church that our lives are sanctified.

Many parishioners will recall with great affection the 25 years from 1984 to 2009 that brought people together in the refitted building at Smeaton Grange. While that experience has long since departed, the collective memory remains for all the right reasons.

So as we move into the future with so much positive anticipation, it's extra helpful to have a clear and enlightened understanding of the reasons for our parish.

The United States National Conference of Bishops spoke of the parish in these terms:

Confirmation Programme

Parish personnel, teachers, clergy have done everything genuinely possible to help the parents and carers help their children over the duration of the preparation process.

As the old adage goes, however, a chain is only as strong as its weakest link.

On Friday 24th and Saturday 25th, about 140 children will be confirmed by Bishop Brian. In terms of meeting the requirements of the programme including the completion of books, the following has been observable:

- A reasonably good number of children have been exceptionally well prepared – a tribute to their parents/carers.
- The majority of children have been reasonably prepared – thank you.
- A small but not insignificant number of children would have benefited from more dedicated attention from the adults – parents are encouraged to re-evaluate their priorities in life.

Spiritual formation is vitally important. It provides a relationship with God that forms the bedrock of happiness in our adult years.

Adults and children need to be aware of the difference between pleasure and happiness. Pleasure will delight the senses but this experience fades quickly. And over time, the single addictive pursuit of pleasure will invariably result in an inner restlessness and even spiritual emptiness.

In contrast, happiness nourishes the soul. It derives from qualities of sacrifice, service and humility, and from the practice of holy charity and deeds of mercy.

Most of all, happiness results from a prayerful and continuous relationship with God. When we move towards becoming the kind of people God calls us to be, then prospects for personal happiness are much greater. It brings to us an inner peace and contentment.

These are the reasons why spiritual formation is so important. And when parents/carers embrace this responsibility with love and commitment, they are investing in the future happiness of their children.
