From Saint Augustine

Laetare Sunday

Question: What Is Laetare Sunday?

Most Catholics today are used to the Mass being conducted in English, and they hardly ever think about the fact that Latin remains the official language of the Catholic Church. But occasionally, Latin reasserts itself, as it does in the case of Laetare Sunday.

Answer: Laetare Sunday is the popular name for the Fourth Sunday in Lent. *Laetare* means "Rejoice" in Latin, and the entrance antiphon begins "*Laetare*, *Jerusalem*" ("Rejoice, O Jerusalem").

Because the midpoint of Lent is the Thursday of the third week of Lent, Laetare Sunday has traditionally been viewed as a day of celebration, on which the austerity of Lent is briefly lessened. And on Laetare Sunday, the violet vestments and altar cloths of Lent are set aside, and rose ones are used instead when available. Flowers, which are not encouraged during Lent, may be placed on the altar. Traditionally, the organ was never played during Lent, except on Laetare Sunday.

Laetare Sunday is also known as Rose Sunday or Refreshment Sunday, and it has a counterpart in Advent which is Gaudete Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent, when violet vestments are exchanged for rose ones.

The point of both days is to provide us encouragement as we progress toward the end of each respective penitential season.

Sacrament of Penance Programme 2022/2023

Early indications are that the large and overwhelming number of parents/carers have done remarkably well in preparing their children for their first confession.

Please now further assist the children in forming their consciences. This can be a bit tricky. The idea is that adults assist children in knowing their sins, but to refrain from saying them until with the priest in confession.

Children, therefore, should be able to confess about three sins without becoming vague and dreamy. Upon making their confession, they'll then be issued a penance and asked to say the Act of Contrition.

Thanks to all who have committed to their children's spiritual formation. Very good investment from parents/carers and a wonderful expression of love. Those families who have yet to pick up their completed and stamped workbooks, please collect from the attendants at each Mass this weekend.

Please collect a leaflet after Mass to confirm the ceremony to which the children have been assigned.
