Donation of Palms

Gratitude is extended to our parishioners from Camden and The Oaks who were able to donate palms. Always appreciated. The sprinkling of palms is one of the most special parts at the beginning of the Mass of Palm Sunday.

With people raising the palms, the words in the missal are:

"Almighty ever-living God, sanctify + these branches with your blessing, that we, who follow Christ the King in exaltation, may reach the eternal Jerusalem through him. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Confirmations ~ The Oaks and Camden

Registration and the Timeline will be distributed this week, 1st/2nd April. Candidates will need to have been baptised and celebrated their first confession.

Good Friday Appeal

The appeal for the Holy Land will take place as usual at the 3:00 PM Passion. It is at this sacred ceremony across the universal church that a collection is taken each year to support the ministry and livelihood of the Franciscans – as the custodians – in the Holy Land and preserve the sacred buildings.

In recent years, a most beautiful contemporary church was built at Magdala. Just google Church in Magdala. It's quite stunning as the window behind the sanctuary looks out onto the Sea of Galilee.

Contributions from around the world are greatly necessary and appreciated, including our own.

Parishioners who won't be able to attend the 3:00 PM Passion on Good Friday can still collect an envelope from the magazine table and deposit into the normal collection bags over the Easter weekend.

Sacrament of Penance Back-Up Programme

The programme will begin on the weekend of 22/23 April. Children will need to be able to recite the Our Father and the Hail Mary before the programme begins. This could possibly be negotiable but before the first confession, these foundation prayers of our Catholic faith must be known. The Act of Contrition can be learnt during the course of the programme.

Sacraments of Penance, Confirmation and FHC

Transitioning

As a new initiative last year, the programme for First Holy Communion required children to know the words of the Our Father, Hail Mary, and the Act of Contrition. This was a remarkably successful initiative. Overwhelmingly, the children had learnt these prayers and were quite rightly feeling a real sense of accomplishment. And parents were also – and quite appropriately – feeling really pleased and satisfied with their children.

Accordingly, for the 2023/2024 Penance Programme, children will now also be required to know the words of the **Our Father** and the **Hail Mary** as an entry requirement. Why? The reasons go deeper.

There are four parts to the Sacrament of Penance – Sorrow, Confession, Absolution and Penance.

The biggest difficulty experienced by too many children (not a majority but a substantial number, nonetheless) over the past week of First Confessions is that they still don't know these foundation prayers of our Catholic faith.

So presuming <u>sorrow</u> – and after the penitent (being the child) makes a <u>confession</u> of sins – the priest issues a <u>penance</u>, normally in the form of prayers, before then giving <u>absolution</u>.

And if the penitent is completely unable to say the words of the Our Father and Hail Mary, then the penance invariably becomes more like some kind of 'fairy floss' version, and without any real substance. Even for children, this sacrament should be a genuine experience of God's mercy that involves meaningful penance.

The reality is that the children are very different in terms of readiness. Some are excellent, making a good clear confession and then reciting the Act of Contrition with precision and confidence.

Most children were ok. But there were some who weren't quite ready. This is why the process for entry into the Penance Programme needs to include a knowledge of prayer - so as to contribute towards the preparation and readiness of the children.

Confirmation: The ability to recite these prayers will also be a condition for entry into the Confirmation Programme from 2024.
