Father Alan Hartcher OFM

Father Alan Hartcher OFM was a Franciscan priest who was a part of our Parish for over a decade. Father Alan resided in Saint Clare's presbytery until his departure in the days following Christmas 2007 when he moved, for a quieter life, to a small parish in Tasmania. Parishioners will recall Father Alan as a very gentle man who was very supportive of us all during his stay at Saint Paul's. Father Alan at the age of 90 is now in serious decline, We remember him in prayers as he prepares to return to his heavenly home in the coming days.

CONFIRMATION CELEBRATIONS ~ WRAP UP

Wonderful weekend with Bishop Brian confirming a huge number of children as well as a few teenagers, totalling 170 in all. With few exceptions, the overwhelming number of parents and carers were very responsive to the programme requirements.

Bishop Brian was very satisfied with the ceremonies, especially with the readiness and the responsiveness of the children. There was a noticeable reverence and respect among those who had gathered, and there was barely a mouth rotating with the chewing of bubble gum.

A long list of people contributed to the weekend – musicians, vocalists, choristers, admin personal from the parish and school offices, adult servers, teachers from our schools assisting as concierge, IT operators, parents – and especially those who volunteered for special jobs. Great outcome and truly an experience of grace for the newly confirmed.

Bishop Brian has an engaging style with the children and likes to throw around questions to those about to be confirmed. So there was one topic of questioning in which he was looking for answers about love. Among the responses, there was one that took him by surprise:

on: Why do you think you have lots of family members here with you this afternoon? Answer: Because they have to be.

And Bishop Brian likes to ask the children if they're nervous:

Question:	(To one of the boys): Why are you nervous?
Answer	Because at the rehearsal Father Michael said you're going to quiz us.
Question:	(To one of the girls): Why are you nervous?
Answer:	Because we might mess-up.

Reflection: Well the children responded with distinction and with a touch of humour. How could anyone not love the children in our parishes? Beautifully sacred experience for all involved, especially the newly confirmed.
