Father Paul Smith ofm is a Franciscan priest living at Maryfields, Campbelltown. Father Paul has been a brother Franciscan to Father Allan Hartcher ofm for many years. Within the past week he provided the following reflection of Father Allan:

The most blessed time of my priesthood and Franciscan Life was when I was Administrator of what the Bishop [of Wollongong] then called "the Parochial District of St. Clare, Narellan Vale, Parish of Camden." In those years I experienced the growth of a living community, which was enthusiastic and joyful. We had no church but we crowded into the auditorium of a former Masonic Bowling Club. Adults and children enjoyed the informality of it all, as well as some creative liturgy. The parents and children thought it a bonus to have a Friar as their Pastor, as well as other friars and Poor Clares visiting from "Maryfields". The Church of St. Clare is yet to be built, but St. Clare's School is filled with reminders of Franciscan tradition and ministry. The Motto of St. Clare's School, Narellan Vale is: "A Great Flame follows a Small Spark". (Allan Hartcher OFM)

In recent months, Father Allan has been pleased to hear that plans for the Church of St Clare are in process!

Allan was a gentle man and true gentleman. A humble follower of Francis. A devotee of fine liturgy and traditional church music. A welcoming and kind pastor. He was a parish priest for all of his priestly life since 1959 until semi-retirement in 2014, aged then at 81 years of age. He had served in Franciscan parishes in every State of Australia, the last one being the Parish of West Tamar (Launceston TAS) for six years (2008-2013), which he offered to take on after retiring from Narellan Vale/Camden. May he rest in peace.

PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL

Meeting took place on Wednesday 5 July 2023. Essentially, the church has been designed according to contemporary architectural ideas, with strong references to liturgical guidelines. The church is intended to be quite devotional according to Catholic spirituality and yet contain a noble simplicity.

Confirmation Ceremonies ~ Last Word

One of the truly lovely traditions of our parish is the willingness by parishioners to support special appeals with a noticeable generosity.

Well in keeping with this tradition, a decision was taken a few years ago to express gratitude to Bishop Brian with a "Thank Card" card and to then insert a few dollars. This was the case again a few weeks ago when Bishop Brian dedicated almost the entire weekend to our own parish with five ceremonies. And every candidate for Confirmation was made by the Bishop to feel extra special at the moment of their Confirmation.

But there was one problem. Have you ever looked for a "Thank You" card from the newsagents and tried to find one with a really appropriate inscription that's 'fit for purpose'?

The difficulty is that, generally, these inscriptions are dripping with 'gush and slop'. They're not the kind of remarks that would generally be extended from a hard-nosed parish priest to his Bishop.

Well the good news is that a card was eventually purchased with a lovely eye-catching indigenous picture on the outside and blank on the inside. A few more measured words were then provided to convey sincere thanks from both our parishes but avoiding any kind of insufferable sentimentality.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

There's a small number of parishioners who like to receive Holy Communion on the tongue. If a big host has been consecrated, then after the 'Breaking of Bread' these hosts are generally larger and of a different shape than the normal smaller round host. It becomes easier to then place this host on the tongue. If wanting to receive Holy Communion in this way, it could be best to approach the priest.
