THE OAKS AND OAKDALE ~ MASS TIMETABLE

The same as last week with a Holy Communion service at Oakdale and Mass at The Oaks. No other option available at the moment but to improvise.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME

On pause again this weekend and will resume on the weekend of 7th/8th October with the distribution of workbooks. Please try to remain committed to Mass with the children. Further enrolments cannot be accepted after this weekend, forms will be available at all Masses. A very few children have yet to be either assessed on their knowledge of the Our Father, Hail Mary and Act of Contrition, or still need to be reassessed. MIDWEEK MASSES AT CAMDEN ~ PENITENTIAL ACT

All our parishioners – especially those who are retired – should consider occasional attendance at Midweek Mass. Perhaps select a day like Wednesday and come every week. The Word of God and Holy Communion are daily treasures. Suggest rereading the quote at the beginning of the Weekly Message from St Therese of Lisieux.

So our parish assembly will be further enriched by an especially strong familiarity with this version of the Penitential Act.

ST CLARE'S CHURCH

Now moving to within a few months of formally submitting a Development Application to Camden Council. The drawings are looking more impressive with every version. The architects are doing a great job.

HERITAGE HALL

A substantial amount of work has been completed this week with the installation of a floor. The next stage could be – internally – another coat of paint of exactly the same colours. Have a question for people who know a little about painting:

The existing paintwork was applied about 10 years ago. It still looks quite reasonable and may not require a coat at this very moment. However, before new carpet is laid, would this be a good time to apply another coat? Please offer advice to me after any of the Masses this weekend or contact the parish office by phone (4655 8797) or email. In our parishes we try to be genuinely consultative.

The restoration process is as follows: 1. Install new floor 2. Coat of paint (maybe) 3. Carpeting or other quality floor covering (see footnote) 4. New chairs 5. Externally, a concrete path around the perimeter to ensure that rainwater runs away from the building, 6 Landscaping.

We're hoping that the HH will be available for business during Advent and leading up to Christmas.

Footnote: The two large carpet squares that were part of the HH have been rolled up and stored in the kitchen. It may be possible – instead of laying new carpet – to lay a high-quality vinyl that imitates polished floorboards, and then reuse the large carpet squares. WHITE WINE ~ COOKOOTHAMA

Among the various blends and varietals, there's a very good option from the Nugan Estate, called 'Cookoothama', an aboriginal word meaning 'fertile land'.

The wine is available from Dan's over at Macarthur, and possibly other outlets as well.

The discerning connoisseur likes to know the valley from which the grapes were grown and the wine produced. Well, locating the Nugen Estate was a bit tricky. The local shop assistant was asked about the location and needed to reach for her mobile to find the answer. Even then, it was hard to nail the exact whereabouts of the vineyard.

The label on the bottle describes Cookoothama in the following way:

"Vibrant aromas of snow pea, passionfruit and lemongrass lead to a lively palate of guava, kiwifruit and lime zest. A small portion of Semillon, fermented in seasoned barrels, brings additional complexity and texture to the blend."

Could be worth a try. Serve chilled.
