WEEKEND AND MIDWEEK MASSES

Normal midweek Mass schedule now applies.

BUT

On Saturday morning 25 November, the Mass will be at 10:00 AM for the

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

in which about 15 adults of various ages will be baptised, confirmed and admitted to the reception of First Holy Communion. Our Saturday-morning 'regulars' are asked to have a presence and on behalf of the parish provide fraternal and prayerful support.

On Sunday afternoon 26 November, our normal 5:00 PM Mass will be brough forward to 4:00 PM as a 'one-off' for the First Holy Communion ceremony. There will be 20 young children celebrating their FHC at this Mass.

NOVEMBER MASS INTENTIONS

During November, all Masses at The Oaks, Oakdale, Narellan Vale and Camden will be offered for our deceased family members and friends, and especially those listed on the remembrance tables.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL (PPC)

Will report next week about the seminar in Wollongong. From across the diocese there's almost 150 who have been registered to attend. Should be quite interesting.

THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE PROGRAMME ~ COMING UP

Families with baptised children who are now in Year 2 or higher are invited to enrol them in the Sacrament of Penance Programme that will begin on the weekend of 2/3 December. The programme will be administered from this time until well into the Season of Lent. There will be an extended break during the Christmas holidays.

Our Sacramental Programmes are based on Mutual Obligation:

From the parish:

- The many details are provided in a timely and systematic way, beginning with the programme timeline and then the enrolment form the following week.
- ❖ Then on the designated weekends, other resources are provided that include books, help notes, holy cards, medals and mementos.
- A Parish office personnel and the clergy will be available to assist families as the programme progresses.
- The administering of the Penance Programme will involve 'follow-up' to ensure all families are well prepared.
- Records will be retained to assess the readiness of children to progress from the Penance Programme to the First Holy Communion Programme that will be administered later in the year.
- ❖ For FHC and Confirmations, our parish personnel liaise with our highly accomplished musicians and vocalists to ensure all ceremonies are truly sacred and beautiful.
- Similarly, parish personal also liaise with our school fraternities from St Paul's and St Clare's to involve our teachers who, in the case of FHC and Confirmation, provide a concierge service of the highest quality, and who also help in the marking of the books.

From the families, where each of the following requirements can be regarded as 'non-negotiable'.

- o Parents and carers are expected to be motivated and responsive to the programme requirements.
- The obligation of Mass on the weekends with children is an essential component of the programme. Punctuality is important. Children need to have a strong experience of our worshipping community.
- The workbooks contain exercises that should be completed jointly by adults and children working together and sharing their faith.
- o Parents/carers need to pray with the children, ensuring that the designated prayers are known exceptionally well in mind and in heart.
- o If, on reviewing the programme timeline, that it's discovered that the commitments clash with holidays, please do NOT enrol. Delay until the following year.
- o Agree to meet a cost of \$25 which is waived if families are battling.

So in our parishes, the sacramental programmes are built upon a strong foundation of mutual commitment. And on this basis, large numbers of families are very welcome.

If, during the course of the programme, there are adults or carers who are unhappy about the terms of mutual obligation, then these issues must be raised only with myself (Fr Michael). Our parish secretarial personnel are commissioned only for the purpose of providing assistance and guidance. Adults with grievances are welcome to seek a conversation with myself where the starting position will always be mutual obligation.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME

First Holy Communion workbooks will be available for return this weekend and can be picked up from tables set up in the chapel. Books that have been satisfactorily completed will have a parish stamp on the inside front cover. Should your child's book be stamped but with a coloured tab inside, this indicates that a question/puzzle needs to be either revisited or corrected. Those books (with the stamp) do not need to be returned to the parish office for remarking but can be retained by families.

Those families who have been contacted because the workbooks need further attention are welcome to contact the parish office during normal hours if any help is needed, or further copies of assistance sheets are required.
