Dear Parishioners at Camden and The Oaks

2nd Sunday in Lent ~ 25th February 2024

From Vatican City, 18 February 2024: Pope Francis

Last week was the first Sunday of Lent. The Gospel was about Jesus' 40 days of fasting in the wilderness. The following remarks from Pope Francis will resonate with all of us:

On the first Sunday of Lent, Pope Francis focused his Angelus address on the temptation of Jesus in the desert to highlight that it is an invitation for us to enter the proverbial desert to come "in contact with the truth."

Observing that during the 40 days in the desert Christ was in the company of both "wild beasts and angels," the pope reflected that when we enter this symbolic "inner wildness," we too "encounter wild beasts and angels."

These wild beasts assume a deeply symbolic meaning in our "spiritual life," and so "we can think of them as the disordered passions that divide our heart, trying to take possession of it. They entice us, they seem seductive, but if we are not careful, we risk being torn apart by them."

Expanding upon this idea of "disordered passions," the pope suggested that we can conceive of them also as "the various vices," such as "the lust for wealth" or "the vanity of pleasure."

"They must be tamed and fought, otherwise they will devour our freedom," the pope emphasized.

In order to confront these vices that afflict each and every one of us, the pope stressed that we need "to go into the wilderness to become aware of their presence and to face them — and Lent is the time to do it."

Well a short time before Christmas, the HH had been restored in quite a beautiful way thanks to very helpful people like Sonny Aqualina and Angelo Paparo. After all the necessary building works and painting had been completed, everything was cleaned except the oven which was never intended for cooking (heating up only). It might need to be replaced.

So chairs were ordered in mid-December. First heard that there was a delay because of industrial disputation on the docks. Then there was a further delay because of a backlog of merchandise requiring clearance.

So eventually, the delivery was confirmed for Thursday 22nd February. The only difficulty was that our secretaries were advised that these chairs would be delivered only to the footpath outside of the HH. So with the total cooperation of the school, a selection of strong-looking years-six boys were organised to move 100 chairs from the footpath to the HH.

However, a full school liturgy had been confirmed for 2:00 PM in the afternoon when there would be prayers, sacred music, and the blessing of badges for the year-six student leaders. And so what time do you think the furniture truck arrived?

You guessed it: A few minutes past 2:00 PM.

Fortunately, about 10 year-five boys and a couple of male teachers quietly left the church for about 15 minutes to shift the chairs and then returned. Job well done (mercifully). And sincere thanks to those who helped.

So after almost two years, the HH is back in business. Might have to organise a morning tea for all our new kindy mums.

Parish Pastoral Council 21st February

Big night with 19 members of the PPC in attendance. Spirited conversation for a little over 90 minutes.

The first substantial discussion item was focused upon the Bishop's pastoral plan for parishes 'Come see, go make'. For the duration of the year, this pastoral plan will be a permanent agenda item as members continue to focus upon the ways in which the parish can develop and be improved. Lots of thoughts and ideas were shared.

Lent Event

Before the Covid – and over a period of about five years – there had been two parish meals in the HH, one in Lent and one in Advent.

After some discussion, a resolution was reached to revive this pleasant custom. But it was noted that there was really not enough time to organise caterers and advertise for a Lent Event this year.

Accordingly, as a 'one-off', our pastoral programme for this year will include the scheduling of a 'Pentecost Event' on the Saturday evening, 18th May.

Caterers will be organised and meals are about 50% subsidised. And as reliable as ever, Father Michael will look after the beverages that come to all our guests as complimentary. In past years, this has been a seriously good night.

In the course of discussion at the PPC, there was a little reminiscing. And it was recalled how at one parish gathering before the Covid, Father Michael had organised for the delivery of numerous buckets of KFC. There was a mixed reaction with some of the newer members looking in disbelief. Father replied that it seemed like a good idea at the time. And just BTW, there was no wastage.
