4th Sunday in Lent ~ 10th March 2024 ~ Laetare Sunday

Question: What Is Laetare Sunday?

Most Catholics today are used to the Mass being conducted in English, and they hardly ever think about the fact that Latin remains the official language of the Catholic Church. But occasionally, Latin reasserts itself, as it does in the case of Laetare Sunday.

Answer: Laetare Sunday is the popular name for the Fourth Sunday in Lent. *Laetare* means "Rejoice" in Latin, and the entrance antiphon begins "*Laetare, Jerusalem*" ("Rejoice, O Jerusalem").

Because the midpoint of Lent is the Thursday of the third week of Lent, Laetare Sunday has traditionally been viewed as a day of celebration, on which the austerity of Lent is briefly lessened. And on Laetare Sunday, the violet vestments and altar cloths of Lent are set aside, and **rose** ones are used instead when available.

Flowers, which are not encouraged during Lent, may be placed on the altar. Traditionally, the organ was never played during Lent, except on Laetare Sunday.

Laetare Sunday is also known as **Rose Sunday** or **Refreshment Sunday**, and it has a counterpart in Advent which is Gaudete Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent, when violet vestments are exchanged for rose ones.

The point of both days is to provide us encouragement as we progress toward the end of each respective penitential season.

SAVE OUR GRAVES

Dear Michael

Almost three years ago, you signed a petition to 'Save Our Graves,' resisting an attempt by the then- Coalition Government to exclude faith and charitable groups from cemetery management in this state.

In particular, they sought to take over the Catholic Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust (**Catholic Cemeteries**), which had been operating cemeteries in this state for more than 150 years, serving family and friends in their time of grief.

The new NSW Labor Government indicated that it wanted Catholic Cemeteries to continue its operations as a standalone entity not subject to government control, but the NSW Auditor-General continued to insist that CMCT was not a charity but a "controlled entity of the state."

Recently the NSW Court of Appeal – in a unanimous decision – affirmed that Catholic Cemeteries is indeed a charity and not under the control of the NSW Treasury or the Auditor-General.

While Catholic Cemeteries will continue to operate transparently under the authority of the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission and do what it can to facilitate the Auditor-General's oversight of its work, in order to protect against a future government attempting to take over Catholic Cemeteries, it was very important that the Court of Appeal unanimously acknowledged it as a charity.

It was a big victory and a win for the countless bereaved families Catholic Cemeteries serve each year.

And it would not have happened without your support.

You and tens of thousands of people like you raised your voices to let our elected officials know that caring for the dead and those who grieve them is a work of the Church, not a government service.

The overwhelming support of the Save Our Graves petition meant the Government knew that there were many people who wanted Catholic Cemeteries to continue its important mission of mercy, so I am deeply grateful for your cooperation.
