Holy Week Ceremonies

Confirmation Programme

Registration and the distribution of the programme timeline will be conducted this weekend. Children who have (a) been baptised (b) celebrated First Confession and (c) are in Year 6 or higher, are able to enrol. Small forms will be distributed by attendants on both sides of the altar at the conclusion of all Masses. Pens will be available, a small form should be clearly filled in with your child's/children's names and the church where you will be attending for the duration of the programme, this form should then be exchanged for the timeline. Do not take the small form home as your child's name will not be recorded unless the form is handed back this weekend.

On behalf of the children, parents/carers need to accept that mutual obligation applies between the parish and the families. This is a wonderful opportunity for spiritual development and faith sharing within the family. Surely, a time to be embraced!
