In a nutshell, this is a Holy Year with a theme of HOPE.

As a way to share in the blessings of this Jubilee Year, we try to regard ourselves as pilgrims – and specifically – 'Pilgrims of Hope'.

Pilgrimages are a huge part of our Catholic tradition, especially to the ancient sites in Europe and the Holy Land. So to make the pilgrimage experience more accessible, six pilgrimage sites have been designated within our own Diocese of Wollongong.

They are Wollongong, Unanderra, Rosemeadow, Milton, Kangaroo Valley and Penrose Park.

Each pilgrimage site will host opportunities at advertised times during this Holy year. The diocesan website will soon provide details of the times and best opportunities for these sites to be visited by individuals, families and groups.

Penance Programme 2024/25

Families with children in the Sacrament of Penance programme need to complete Chapter 4 of the Workshop Books this week. The chapter is from pages 24 to 30, and every puzzle and activity must be completed. Attendance at Mass also needs to be recorded. As books need to be returned next weekend for marking, parents should check every page to ensure their son or daughter has completed each and every section. Books not completed to a satisfactory standard are returned for further working. Page 29 the story of Zacchaeus quite often is handed in incomplete, please check that the top section as well as the story on the lower section are both completed. The Parish office is always available for further assistance if needed.

When families attend the Prayer Assessment evenings scheduled for 11 and 12 March, or the Celebration of Reconciliation at the end of March it will be necessary for everyone to observe the quietness and reverence of the church. The practice of children seeing friends and exchanging loud greetings and conversation before, after and even during Mass should be discouraged, it disturbs other parishioners praying and their devotion to the Mass. Parents are asked to please assist by explaining and enforcing this with their children.
