## Third Sunday of Lent ~ Year C ~ 22/23 March 2025

This Sunday is the Third Sunday of Lent when we reflect on the call to conversion and repentance, with the Gospel readings focusing on Jesus' teachings and actions, particularly the parable of the fig tree.

#### **Tuesday 25 March**

### The Annunciation of the Lord

The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord commemorates the moment when God assumes human nature within the womb of the Virgin Mary.

# **Carrington Volunteers**

## Weekly Stations of the Cross

Stations of the Cross are being commemorated after the 9.00 am Mass each of the Fridays during Lent. All parishioners are encouraged to attend, even once during the Lenten period.

The fourteen-step devotion is a very special part of our Easter preparation.

### Penance Programme 2024/25

Leaflets will be distributed at all Masses this weekend that contain the names of the children and the ceremonies to which they've been assigned.

From last week's notice - which included the types of sins that could be committed by children - parents should now be well equipped to assist their children in their examination of conscience.

This is extremely important. When children come to the confession, they should NOT be fuzzy minded and unsure about what to confess. When children don't know what to confess, they whisper.

It's a source of serious annoyance if - at the time of the confession - it's left to the priest to ask the child questions to extract a confession of sins. Though priests are always willing to be helpful, it's not their job to be a substitute for a process that belongs primarily to the parents.

If a confession is not adequate, absolution and penance will not be given. Your child will not have made a confession and you will be advised accordingly. Please, do not send your child to the priest unless he/she is properly prepared.

So the job is for the parents to guide their children into being able to confess at least three sins without needing to be prompted by the priest. But the tricky part is that the confession from the children should not be made to the parents. Instead, talk to the children and ask them if they can confess three sins, but not actually say them until with the priest.

In terms of practicalities - and because of the shortage of priests - Father James and Father Michael will be the only confessors.

Accordingly - and to avoid long waiting times - with each ceremony to start 'on the hour', those whose birthdays are between:

The 1st and 10th of the month should arrive 'on the hour'.

The 11th and the 20th of the month, at 20 minutes past the hour.

The 21st and onwards at 40 minutes past the hour.

There are 8 blocks of pews in the church. Moving anti-clockwise, the first block (near the baptism font) and the eighth block (behind the organ) are not permitted for seating. It's important to be at a reasonable distance when children are making a confession. Besides respecting confidentiality, if people are too close, children will talk so softly as to be inaudible.

There should be a quietness in the church at all times. Please move around the church without disturbing others.

The votive candle stand - normally near the tabernacle - will be repositioned in the chapel before the altar. As families leave, it is suggested that they make an offering of thanksgiving to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This is not intended as a money-making exercise, however, teaching the children about expressing gratitude is important. An offering of a dollar would be appropriate.
