Because of the limited numbers able to be accommodated within the churches, 36 at Oakdale and 16 at The Oaks we still have Covid 19 arrangements in place. The Oaks is strictly by prior arrangement through contact with Susie Freestone. Oakdale is usually able to accommodate those wanting to attend, should you be aware of anyone who would like to attend Mass and has not yet done so, please ask them to contact Susie on 4657 1723 she is very happy to hear from them.

Burragorang Road is now open at Back Creek which makes it much easier and safer for those parishioners attending St Joseph the Worker to come by the direct route.

St Paul's at Camden is only able to have 100 worshipers so everyone is encouraged to book either on line or by contact with the parish office on 4655 8797. Office bookings should be made by Friday morning 11.00am. Parishioners who just turn up are admitted if there is room within the church. The very good news is that Saint Paul's Primary school has requested permission for one class to attend morning Mass on each of Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, subject to the teachers and children following Covid 19 requirements Father Michael has agreed, so from this week we have had the children back in the church which is very pleasing.
