**Weekend Masses**

The Mass timetable during November chops about with Confirmations this weekend and First Holy Communion on 21/22 November.

Now here is a big challenge for our parishioners. On the weekend of FHC, it won't be possible to offer as many Masses as usual to our dedicated parishioners. Apologies in advance. But for those who are resourceful and are interested in the idea of having a monastic start to the day, there will be a one-off 6:00 AM Mass on Sunday the 22<sup>nd</sup> November.

What a great way to start the day? And if enough people are sufficiently interested, we could have Adoration from 5:30 AM. Please keep in mind the beautiful words of the Sunday hymn so often sung so beautifully in pre-pandemic times by our choir:

*'O day of light, and life, and grace, from earthly toil a resting place'.*

Wonderful spiritual medicine for the soul. And who doesn't need that kind of medicine?



**Confirmation Programme**

Almost 120 young parishioners will celebrate their Confirmation this weekend in rather unique circumstances. For the only time this century in our own parish (and perhaps even never before), the Sacrament has been linked to the Great Feast of All Saints. So for a variety of reasons, our celebrations this year will be extra special and very memorable.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, large numbers of people who would travel for work each day in an office have been working from home.

In the case of our families for Confirmation, the preparation has been two-dimensional – (a) working at home through the Confirmation books by parents with their children and (b) having a presence over the weekend at our parish Masses. So:

A survey form will be prepared for distribution after Masses next week, 7/8 November. Parents are invited to complete the form and return it to the parish office within a week. Ideally, we would like at least 30 parents to participate in the survey. The information will be very useful in discerning how to best administer the sacramental programmes for children from the beginning of next year. With thanks.



## Spiritual Insight

This week 1<sup>st</sup> November is the **Solemnity of All Saints**. St Bernard of the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> centuries – who was a deeply spiritual man and who became Abbot of the Monastery of Clairvaux – had this to say about the feast:

Our songs of praise do not avail them nor do they need our honours. Surely, we are the ones to benefit when we venerate their memory. I confess that at the thought of them I am consumed by a loving desire to be with them.

So our old mate Bernard has two wishes: **The first** is to eventually be at home in the assembly of the apostles and in the numerous hosts of the martyrs, welcome in the college of confessors and the choirs of virgins – in a word to be united in the communion of all the saints.

**The second** wish when we commemorate the saints, according to St Bernard, is that Christ who is our life may manifest himself as powerfully to us as he did to them.

Bernard adds that in aspiring to a life of blessedness we should petition the saints in prayer so that what we cannot attain by our own efforts may be granted to us through their intercession.

Question for families over the evening meal – which saints would you like to meet when you enter the Kingdom of Heaven.
