Biblical Insight

From the Franciscan priest, Father Richard Rohr OFM in his book, 'The Universal Christ':

It's time for Christianity to rediscover the biblical theme of restorative justice, which focuses on rehabilitation and reconciliation and not punishment. Restorative justice, of course, comes to its full demonstration in the constant healing ministry of Jesus who never punished anybody.

Yes, he challenges people, but always for the sake of insight, healing and restoration of people and situations to their divine origin and source. Once a person recognises that Jesus' mission was to heal people, not punish them, the dominant theories of retributive justice begin to lose their appeal and authority (page 142).

Save Our Graves

The NSW Government has indicated an intention to take over cemeteries and graves, including the beautiful Catholic chapels at Rookwood. The Archbishop of Sydney, Very Reverend Anthony Fisher, has strongly opposed this decision and received wide media coverage. The Archbishop has also initiated an on-line petition.

Would you please join the Church in opposing this 'take-over' of church assets that have been accumulated for Catholic families by the Church's Board of Management for Cemeteries for over 150 years.

Mass Times and Baptisms

'Reminder that the changes announced in last week's Weekly Message are still on track to be introduced on the first weekend in July. These changes are (1) Masses in Camden to be celebrated at 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM on Sunday mornings, and (2) baptisms to be celebrated in the parish on Sundays only. Visiting priests for baptisms will be required to celebrate the baptism at 12 noon, or possibly 12:30 PM.

#### **Sacrament of Penance Programme**

#### Parents/Carers:

The following should be accomplished so far:

- ✓ The books should be fully completed to a very high standard and handed-in this week at Masses.
- ✓ The children, as well as yourselves, should be able to recite the Act of Contrition, without hesitation.
- ✓ The children should have a sense of sin and wrongdoing, such as:

Disobedience, laziness, gluttony, lying, theft, selfishness, hurtful words, 'colourful' and coarse language, neglect of animals entrusted to their care, fighting with brothers and sisters.

The parents/carers need to assist the children – taking at least 30 minutes if necessary – to examine their consciences, but without them (the children) actually making their confession at that time.

The confession should only be made to the priest. Parents should not hurry this process. Set aside quality time. Over past years, it's become quite apparent that some parents have been a little negligent, and the consciences of their children have lacked proper formation for a 'First Confession'.

In the two ceremonies scheduled for the 16<sup>th</sup>, the first is for those parents who also want to make a heart-felt confession. There will be a visiting priest available to assist. Adults should rise above fear and nervousness. In the workbooks completed by the children, there are instances where Pope Frances encourages the adults to embrace such an opportunity. It's a cleansing and sanctifying experience; it's a wonderful example to the children.

The second session at 7:00 PM is presumed for the children only although adults can still make a confession if they have a change of mind.

# **Confirmation Programme**

All families need by this weekend to have supplied Confirmation names and sponsors.

Books will be collected and will be examined during the coming week. The Final Leaflet will be distributed next weekend. It will provide a listing of the Ceremonies and Masses to which the families have been assigned.

The leaflet distributed last weekend was '*interim*' and there may be changes depending upon the quality of the workbooks.

It's a bit like a horse race at Royal Randwick. As soon as the horses pass the winning post, the dividends are posted on the screens. But they are '*interim*' because the winning horses and jockeys need to confirm they have the '*correct weight*'. And, also, that there have been no protests relating to interference from the winning horse and the place getters. Once – generally after just a few minutes – a fairly-run race has been established, the interim dividends become final dividends.

Also, if there happens to be further complications with the spread of the virus, and if the NSW Department of Health suddenly changed the social distancing requirements from 'one person per two square metres' to 'one person per four square metres', the covid capacity of the church would be halved.

Currently, each family is able to have <u>seven</u> people at the Ceremonies and Masses including candidate and sponsor (9 for those with two children being Confirmed). But if there was a change – as described in the paragraph above – the number would be reduced to <u>four</u>.
