RE: WEEKLY MESSAGE FOR WEEKEND 9/10 OCTOBER 2021

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

There's a book entitled 'Rebuilt' that was authored in 2013. It's about the revival of a Catholic parish in the USA. The parish priest, Father Michael, writes the following:

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Knowledge is important. St Paul teaches us to be transformed by the renewal of our minds, to let the truth in to change us, to reshape us, to move us to a new place (Rm 12:2). We need to have the right brain food to change. But knowledge alone cannot be our goal. As St. Paul also teaches, knowledge of God without love is nothing (1 Cor 13:2).

The biblical idea of knowledge goes much deeper than just cerebral understanding. It implies intimacy. To know in biblical terms means we really experience something in our hearts as well as our heads. In all aspects of our personhood, it is knowledge that leads to love, while love, in turn, makes us want to know more. Transformation and life-change must be the goals of discipleship, and simply sharing knowledge doesn't make disciples (page 79).

Timeline and Enrolment Forms now available from the parish website. It's all very self-explanatory but in a somewhat convoluted way. So far, there's been remarkably few calls to the parish office. This could mean either:

- (a) that all our parents and carers understand the operation of the abbreviated programme, or
- (b) lots of people are not too concerned so far and will make a last-minute dash to be included.

We're sincerely hoping it's the former reason.

BTW: Parents and carers with children preparing for FHC should read and try to understand the following points:

- Our Lord's death on the cross was all about sacrifice. Indeed, his whole life was a living sacrifice, but his death on the cross for sinful humanity was the supreme sacrifice.
- Over a period of about 1400 years from Abraham to John the Baptist, the <u>lamb</u> was sacrificed by the Jewish people as an offering of thanksgiving and atonement, especially when commemorating the Passover.
- That's why, because he was of Jewish stock, Jesus is called the Lamb of God. In his passion and death, he became the sacrificial lamb in offering up his body and blood.
- But at The Last Supper on the night before he died, he said so very solemnly that his body and blood would continue to be present mysteriously under the species of bread and wine. This is one of the great mysteries of our Catholic faith.
- That is why when we receive Holy Communion, we receive mysteriously and sacramentally the Body and Blood of the dying sacrificial Jesus.
- The Eucharist, therefore, is all about sacrifice. The Eucharist could also be called the 'Sacrifice of the Cross'.

So parents and carers, please be mindful that sacrifice is an indispensable part of the preparation process for FHC. The larger the sacrifice, the better the preparation. Transform your own thinking and teach the children to commit from the heart.

Urgent - Join in Opposition to Euthanasia in NSW before October 11 The move to make Euthanasia / Voluntary Assisted Dying (VAD) legal will be introduced into the NSW Parliament in coming days.

We are called to stand up for the sanctity of life and oppose 'the culture of death'. What can you do? Bishop Mascord encourages the faithful throughout the Diocese of Wollongong to urgently contact their local state MPs directly, in order to strongly encourage local politicians to oppose the proposed legislation and vote 'No'. Please note, that advocates of Assisted Suicide, a small but well organised group, are working very hard to lobby local MPs around NSW to

Without similar efforts from those who oppose euthanasia, it will be very difficult to stop this terrible bill from becoming law.
